Issuance No:P-8Issuance Date:7/1/2023Subject:WIOA Youth Locally Defined Barriers

The Workforce Development Board of North Missouri has established locally-defined barriers that expand eligibility into the local WIOA Youth Program. The use of these barriers requires approval by the WDB Executive Director or their designee.

## **Out-of-School:**

A <u>low-income</u> individual who requires additional assistance to enter or complete an educational program or to secure or hold employment. The individual must have one (1) of the following barriers:

- Fired / Terminated from employment in the last 12 months (supported by termination letter or applicant statement);
- No employment history. This includes youth who have only been able to obtain part-time or seasonal employment but are seeking full-time employment. (supported by applicant statement or UI wage data);
- Substance Abuse; (supported by documentation from referring partner agency or applicant statement)
- Lacks occupational goals/skills; (supported by documentation from referring partner agency or applicant statement)
- Incarcerated parent(s) (supported by documentation from referring partner agency, incarceration records, or applicant statement); or
- Domestic violence (supported by documentation from referring partner agency or applicant statement)
- Migrant Youth

## In-School:

A <u>low-income</u> individual who requires additional assistance to enter or complete an educational program or to secure or hold employment. No more than 5 percent of the In-School Youth may be made eligible by using the barriers listed below.

- Fired / Terminated from employment in the last 12 months (supported by termination letter or applicant statement);
- At risk of drop out (supported by letter from school official);
- Attending an alternative school (supported by letter from school official)
- Behavioral problems at school (supported by letter from school official);
- Substance Abuse (supported by documentation from referring partner agency or applicant statement);
- Incarcerated parent(s) (supported by documentation from referring partner agency, incarceration records, or applicant statement); or

- Domestic violence (supported by documentation from referring partner agency or applicant statement)
- Migrant Youth
